QUEEN VICTORIA

Every year, on the Monday before May 25, people across Canada celebrate Victoria Day. Even though Queen Victoria lived and died a long time ago, people still celebrate her birthday because this queen was very important in Canadian history.

For many years, the area that is now Canada was a British **colony**. Although the leaders in Canada had some power, decisions had to go through the government in England. The British kings and queens ruled over Canada through their **representatives** in this country.

Victoria was born on May 24, 1819. She was the daughter of the Duke and Duchess of Kent. Her father died when she was very young. As a child, she studied subjects like languages, arithmetic, drawing, and music.

After three of her uncles died, Victoria became the **heir** to the throne. She was crowned queen on June 28, 1838, becoming Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland. Later she became the **Empress** of India as well. She was also queen of Canada.

Queen Victoria married Prince Albert in 1840 and together they had nine children. Victoria never visited Canada, but five of her children did.

Many people wanted Canada to become its own country. Queen Victoria agreed.



On July 1, 1867, Canada became an **independent** country with the queen as its official leader. She helped to make many of the decisions that later affected the country. For example, she chose red and white as Canada's official colours. The capital city of British Columbia is named for her.

Queen Victoria remained queen until her death in 1901, at the age of 81. She had **reigned** for 63 years. Only Queen Elizabeth II has reigned longer than that.



SRI LANKA

Sri Lanka is a small island country located in the Indian Ocean off the southeast coast of India. About 23 million people live in this country that is about 432 kilometres long and 224 kilometres wide.

Sri Lanka was a British **colony** for almost 150 years. It became **independent** in 1948. The country used to be called Ceylon or Serendip, and its nickname is “Pearl of the Indian Ocean” because of its beauty. The country’s name became Sri Lanka in 1972.

In the middle of the country is an area of mountains shaped like a triangle. That area is surrounded by plains with both wet and dry forests. Many different animals live in Sri Lanka, including elephants, leopards, bears, and birds.




These animals are in danger because people are cutting down forests for wood such as **teak** and **ebony**.

Almost three-quarters of the people who live in Sri Lanka are Buddhist, but many are Hindu, Muslim, or members of other religions. People speak several different languages, including Bengali, Hindi, Sinhala, Tamil, and English.

Sri Lanka is a **republic** with a president in charge. The current president is named Gotabaya Rajapaksa. The capital city of the country is Colombo.

Recently, Sri Lanka has had many problems. The country does not have money to buy goods from other countries, including **fuel**. Because they don't have fuel, power can only be provided to part of the country at a time. People have to deal with **blackouts** for up to 13 hours a day. The government is working to try to find a solution to fix this problem.



Colony: A territory that has been settled by people from another country and is controlled by that country.

Independent: Not controlled or affected by other people or things.

Teak: The strong, hard, yellowish-brown wood of a tree that grows in southeast Asia.

Ebony: A hard, heavy wood that comes from tropical trees.

Republic: A country that is governed by elected representatives and by an elected leader (such as a president) rather than by a king or queen.

Fuel: A material (such as coal, oil, or gas) that is burned to produce heat or power.

Blackouts: A period when lights are off because of an electrical power failure.

IMMIGRATION

Your classmates probably have all kinds of last names. Some might have names that are Polish, Indian, Chinese, or Scottish. Most people in Canada are the **descendants** of people who moved here from other countries. Some Canadians moved here themselves. Immigration has helped to make Canada what it is now.

Immigration is the act of moving from one country to go live in another. Sometimes people choose to immigrate because of a job or to be near family. At other times, people are forced to leave their own countries because of war or other problems. These people are called **refugees**.

Moving to a different country can be a **complicated** process. Refugees often flee from their own countries into camps where they stay until another country accepts them. They might not have a choice about where to go. Other immigrants usually decide where they want to live. They apply to the government of that country to ask for **permission** to move there. When they receive permission, they can immigrate to the new country.

Canada has several different **categories** for immigrants. Some immigrants might come as students or temporary workers and decide that they want to stay. Other immigrants want to join family members who are already here. Business owners who want to start companies in



Canada can have special permission to come. In 2021, the Canadian government set a goal of receiving 401,000 new immigrants into the country.

Things that are happening in the world can affect how many people are immigrating, as well as where they are coming from. Sometimes large numbers of immigrants come from Africa or Europe and sometimes Asia or South America. Recently, most immigrants have come from

Ukraine, India, China, the Philippines, Nigeria, and France. These newcomers are helping to make Canada what it is.



Descendants: Someone who is related to a person or group of people who lived in the past.

Refugee: A person who is forced to leave his or her home or country to escape war, persecution, or a natural disaster.

Complicated: Difficult to use or understand because of having many different parts or ideas.

Permission: Consent; an agreement to allow something to happen.

Category: A group of people or things that has certain characteristics in common.
