**Snuneymuxw** (snu ne mux): A tribe near Nanaimo, Vancouver Island, Britsh Columbia

Inuit (in ooit): Indigenous Peoples of Northern Canada

Inuk (in ook): Singular, one Inuit

**Kangiqsualujjuaq** (kang gi swal i swak): A community in Nunavik

Nunavik (noon a vik): A region of Northern Quebec

Kuujjuaq (ku tjuaq): A community in Nunavik

Inuktitut (i nookte toot): The Inuit language

**Inuit Tapitiit Kanatami** (tape re it kana zami): A national Inuit organization

Nunavut (noon a voot): A region in Northern Canada

**Inuvialiut** (in u vial uit): A region in Northern Canada in Canada's western Arctic

**Mi'kmaq** (mik mak): Indigenous Peoples on the eastern Canadian coast

Taba'gan (taba gan): Toboggan

**Haudenosaunee** (ho den oh SHOW nee): The Mohawk, Seneca, Onondaga, Cayuga, and Tuscarora Nations who live in northeastern North America

**Pemmican** (pemiken): Beef jerky-like survival food

Haida (hi da): Tribe on the west coast of British Columbia

**Kwak waka' wakw** (KWOK wok ya wokw): Tribe on the west coast of British Columbia

**Mukluks** (muk luks): Warm winter boots made of leather and rabbit fur

Siksika (sik sika): A First Nation in British Columbia

**Sto: lo** (sto lo): A tribe in British Columbia between Langley and Yale

Salish (saliSH): A First Nations in British Columbia

Anishinaabe, Sagamok (an ishin abe, sag amok): A First Nation in Northern Ontario
